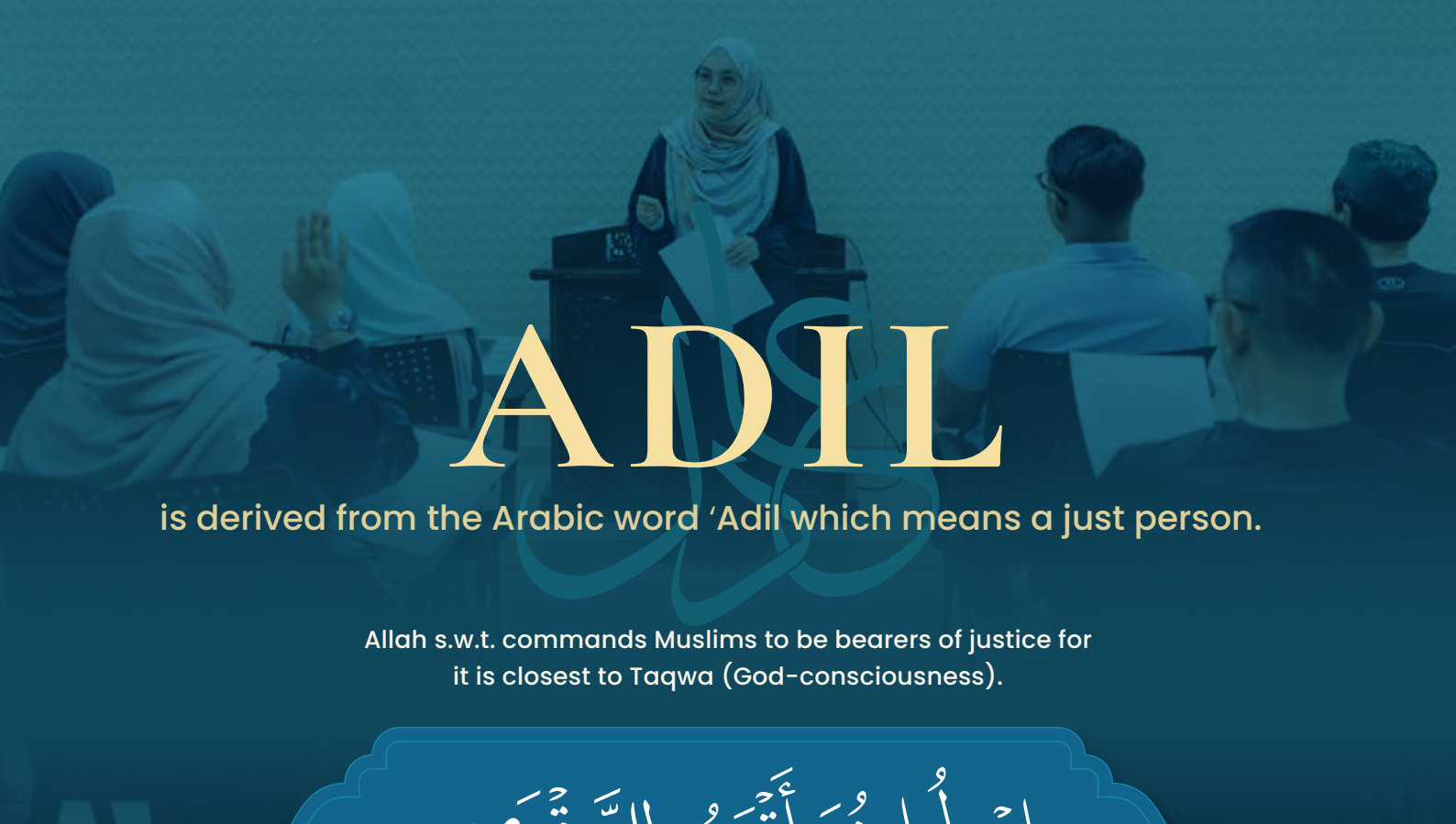

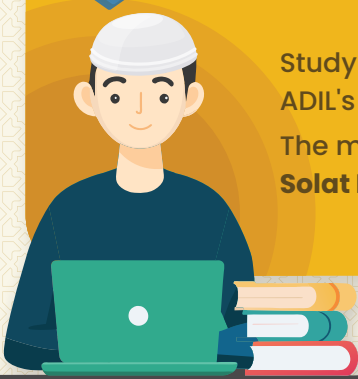

Academic Year (AY)

ADIL Academic Year (AY) is a 2-year comprehensive Islamic education programme that covers all ADIL modules. Classes are typically held weekly and cover both core and elective modules, providing a clear pathway for adults pursuing Islamic learning. ADIL AY is a non-examination-based programme that enriches the Islamic learning experience for Muslim adults in Singapore. It addresses the emerging needs of the community and provides Islamic learning in a structured manner, while offering opportunities to interact and engage with asatizah.

◆ Who is it for? ◆

The programme is open to any adult who wishes to build or deepen their foundational knowledge of Islam. Youth aLIVE graduates are also welcome to continue their learning journey here. By covering both Core and Elective modules in a structured and interactive manner, ADIL Academic Year provides a comprehensive Islamic education that caters to the diverse interests and needs of adult learners.

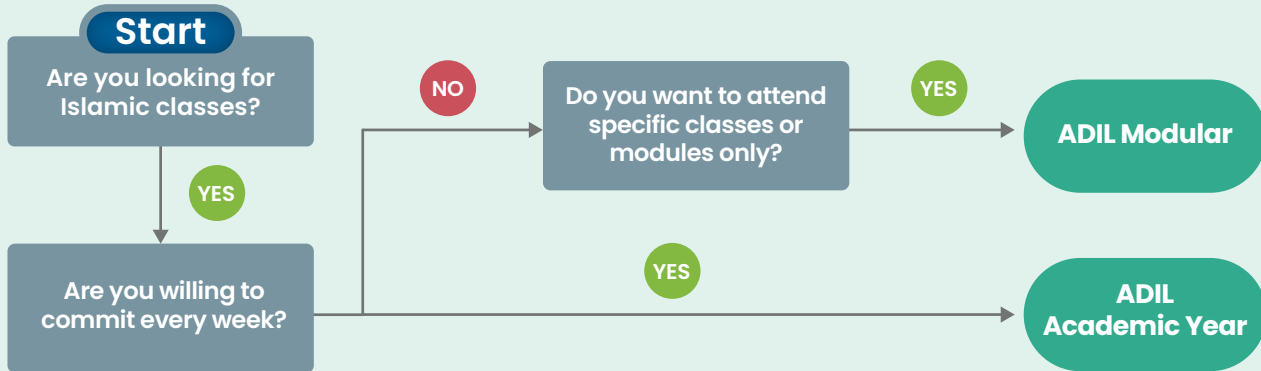

◆ Frequently Asked Questions ◆

I am just starting to learn the religion. Where should I start?

If you prefer to start light, you can attend individual core modules to get a feel for the foundational aspects of Islam. If you are ready to commit to a more structured learning experience that covers everything systematically, the Academic Year (AY) programme may be the right fit as it covers all core and elective modules over two years.

How do I register for the ADIL AY programme?

You may go to learnislam.sg and click on your preferred AY Centre to register.

Why do different AY Centres arrange their modules differently?

The sets are arranged differently to provide you flexibility and options to pick, especially for AY Centres within the same mosque district.

How is ADIL AY different from the Centres that offer single modules?

ADIL AY covers all core and elective modules in 2 years on a weekly basis. Whereas single modules are short term and will be only offered on an ad-hoc basis.

Can I change AY Centres? Or choose to only attend one module?

Yes you may do so. Please refer to your respective AY Centre for more details.

Can I join the programme midway if I missed the registration in January?

Absolutely! You are welcome to join at any point in the year. Your two-year journey simply begins from when you enrol. Any modules offered before you joined will come around again after your second year, so you can pick them up then and continue your Islamic learning. Alternatively, you may also attend any missed modules as modular classes at a mosque of your choice.

Are there any refund policies for withdrawals?

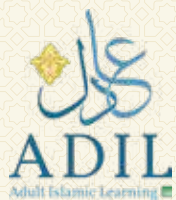
No, there are no refund policies for withdrawals as the programme fee is paid monthly and not annually.

How will I be notified of my confirmation?

The AY Centre that you have registered with will notify you on the confirmation.

Will I receive a certificate and further my studies with it?

Participants who complete the whole programme will receive a certificate of completion by the mosque. Currently, it is an endorsement of the completion but cannot be used for furthering of studies.
